# NARCISSISTS' PERCEPTIONS AND BEHAVIOR DRIVE OSTRACISM

Why?
Narcis

Ostracism = feeling excluded and ignored.

Narcissists may be particularly at risk for ostracism.

Narcissists' hostile perception of social cues may result in higher likelihood of narcissists feeling excluded (e.g. Cascio et al., 2015). Narcissists may display group-disturbing behaviors that motivate others to factually exclude them more often (e.g. Leckelt et al., 2015). There might be a reverse causality relationship of narcissism and ostracism where narcissism is an antecedent and outcome of being excluded (e.g. Nielsen & Knardahl, 2015).

### **STUDIES 1 & 2: MAIN HYPOTHESIS**

Narcissists report more frequent ostracism in a representative panel (N = 1592) and in experience sampling (N = 113, 21 days).

## STUDIES 3 & 4: PERCEPTION

Narcissists' sensitivity to exclusion cues is stronger in ambiguous exclusion situations (Study 4, N = 258) than in unambiguous exclusion situations (Study 3, N = 362).

### **STUDY 5: BEHAVIOR**

Others factually exclude narcissists more often because of their narcissistic traits (N = 321).

## **STUDY 6: REVERSE CAUSALITY**

Vulnerable narcissism predicts ostracism six months later, but ostracism does not predict narcissism ( $N_{T1} = 487$ ,  $N_{T2} = 264$ ).
